>> Write, upload, or link to your content

Add hashtags using the # symbol

HOW TO ADD A HASHTAG IN AN ARTICLE

From the homepage, click Write an article under the update field.

When you are ready to publish your drafted
article, click Publish in the top right corner. A pop-up window will appear.

You cannot edit or remove hashtags after you've hit publish
